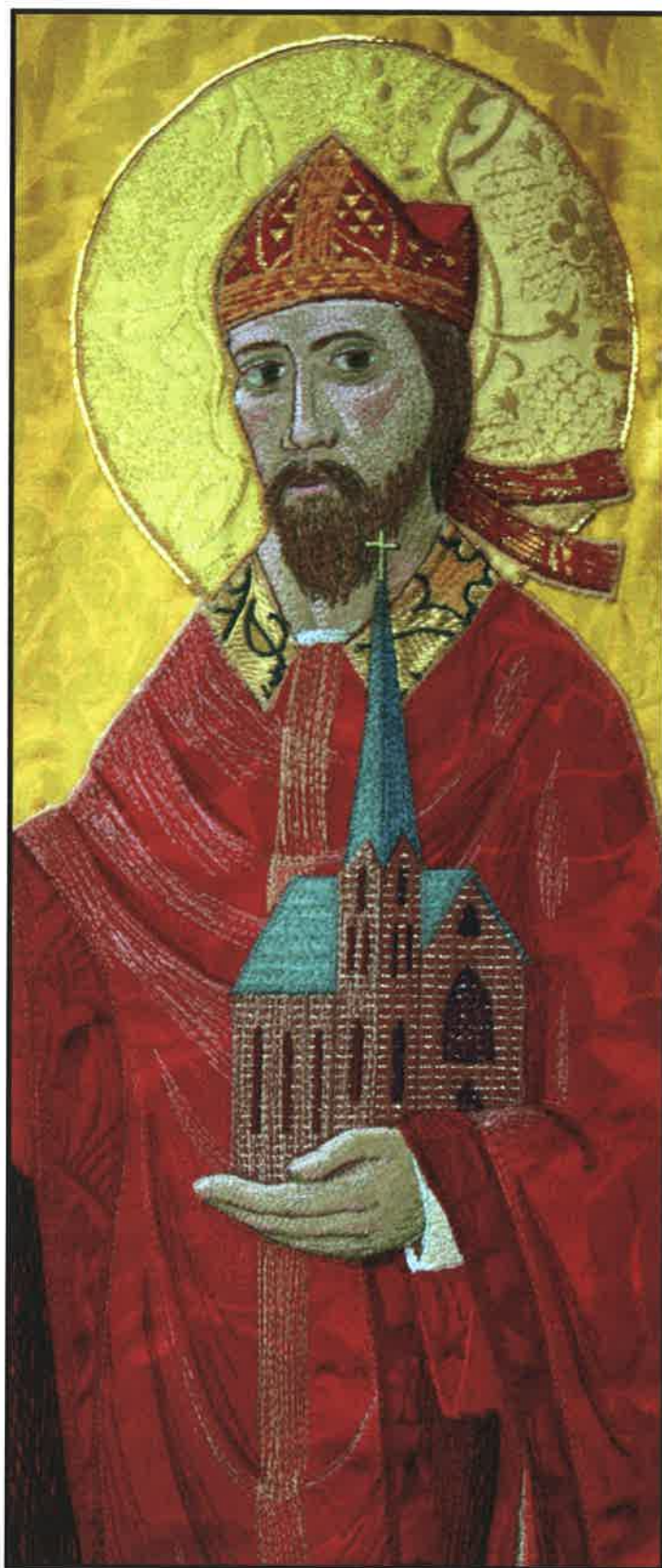

From the Pastor's Desk

Next weekend during the Masses, we will be celebrating the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Catholics eligible for the sacrament include: *[From the Instruction on the Pastoral Care of the Sick]*

- ◆ A person who is seriously sick – the sacrament may be repeated if the sick person recovers after being anointed and then again falls ill or if during the same illness the person's condition becomes more serious.
- ◆ A sick person may be anointed before surgery whenever a serious illness is the reason for the surgery.
- ◆ Elderly people may be anointed if they have become notably weakened even though no serious illness is present.
- ◆ Sick children may be anointed if they have sufficient use of reason to be strengthened by the sacrament.

After the Masses next weekend the priest will pray over anybody else wanting prayers (e.g., for addictions, minor illnesses, strength, faith, etc.).
