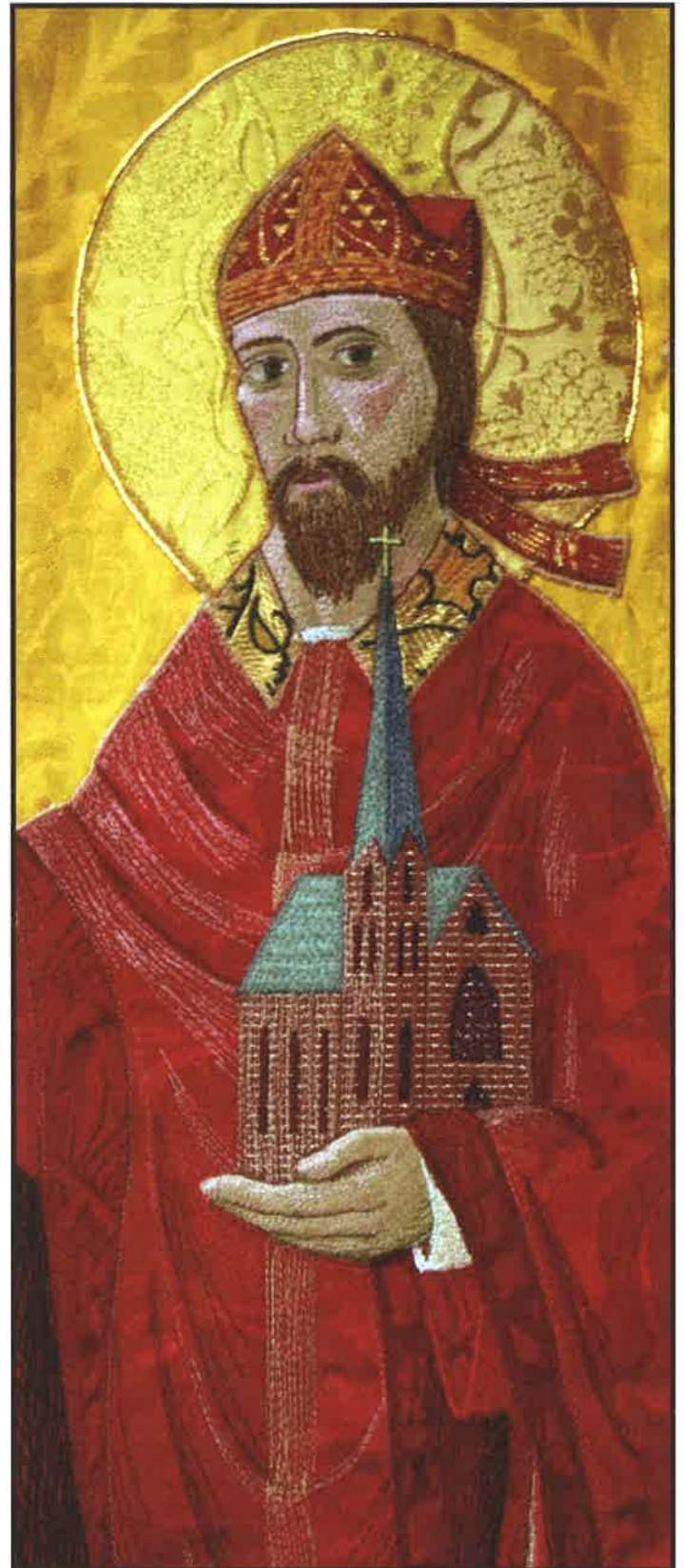

From the Pastor's Desk... Sabbatical

In our diocese after ten years of service a priest can apply for a 3-4 month sabbatical. A sabbatical is a time apart from normal priestly ministry dedicated either to further study and/or further spiritual growth and renewal.

Last fall I sent a letter to the Bishop asking for permission to do a sabbatical at the Magdala Center in Israel, near the Sea of Galilee. I recently received permission from him. I first learned of the Magdala Center on a previous trip to the Holy Land. The Magdala Center has a volunteer program by which volunteers can live and work together at the Center.

Through this experience I will have the opportunity of living, studying, praying, and working in the region of Galilee. Volunteers commit to work at the center and live the rhythm of prayer and work there. Twice a week volunteers go on excursions to holy sites and other sites of cultural and historical significance in Israel. There are also lectures during the week at the Center.

My intention was to do this in the February-April timeframe so that I could be back in time for all of the events of May and June (particularly Brett's ordination and First Mass). However, due to some delays, the permissions and acceptances came too late for that timeframe. So I will be leaving a couple of days after Easter and will return at the end of June. I have promised Brett I will be praying for him in the Holy Land on the day of his ordination.

I am able to do this because I have complete confidence in Fr. Hartge's and Fr. Dooley's capabilities to oversee the consortium as well as due to our excellent staffs. The Bishop agreed that the two of them would do well to oversee things for the three months. I want to thank them for their willingness to do so. It is often quite hectic when one of us is gone for a week as everything falls on two priests' shoulders. This will be quite an extended time for them like that. However, when I first broached the subject with them last summer, they both insisted that I take the opportunity while I have the chance. So I appreciate their generosity and ask you to go easy on them while I am away. ☺

I will certainly miss you all during my sabbatical, but I am confident that this is the path of the Lord and thus we will all benefit. I am very excited at the idea of living and walking the land that Jesus so loved. I am particularly excited that I was able to find a place outside of Jerusalem. The Sea of Galilee area is still very undeveloped – actually they say it was more populated at the time of Jesus. The perfect place for prayer, study, work, and rest. I'm sure I will be giving periodic updates through Facebook, etc.

Catholic Foundation Awards The LIFE Pregnancy Center

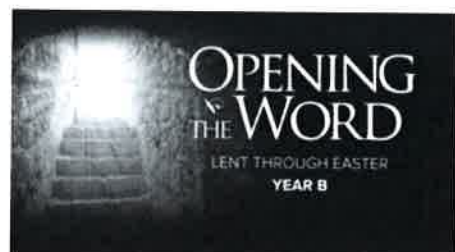
The LIFE Pregnancy Center acknowledges a \$10,000.00 grant received from the Catholic Foundation to assist funding an exterior beautification project to complement the newly constructed pregnancy medical center. The monies will help finance an outdoor patio setting, signage, landscaping, and the renovation of the perimeter wall in the back of the building.

The grant application was made through the St. Colman of Cloyne Catholic Church's social impact services which supports the work of the Center. The Center has been privileged to be chosen as a recipient of the Catholic Foundation Responsive Grant for the third year. A 2016 grant of \$20,000.00 helped purchase the property and kick-start the capital campaign for the new facility. A 2017 grant of \$40,500.00 helped finance the building's framework.

Christ is standing at the door of our hearts, knocking, seeking relief from the pain and suffering found around world. He comes to us bearing the disguise of the vulnerable refugee, the immigrant family, and the poor and marginalized, and our faith calls us to respond. Your generosity to The Catholic Relief Services Collection (CRSC) helps six Catholic organizations comfort Christ, whom we find in the suffering brothers and sisters in our midst.

With your help, the Parishes Organized to Welcome Refugees (POWR) program has organized thousands of volunteers to help refugees with legal work, medical services, and language skills. The volunteers have offered friendship, warm meals, and jobs and have welcomed the newcomers into local parishes, providing a smooth transition to their new home.



When refugees come to the United States, housing must be secured within a short time frame. In Portland, Oregon, this is a significant challenge, because the city has one of the highest rental occupancy rates in the country. But with your support of the CRSC, Holy Trinity Parish has been able to offer a nine-bedroom home and send volunteers to welcome refugee newcomers, giving space and support during their initial adjustment, while permanent housing is secured and set up. Refugees typically stay in the house no more than three weeks before they move into permanent housing. Now, Holy Trinity Parish is working with other faith-based organizations to replicate this program in other Portland neighborhoods.
