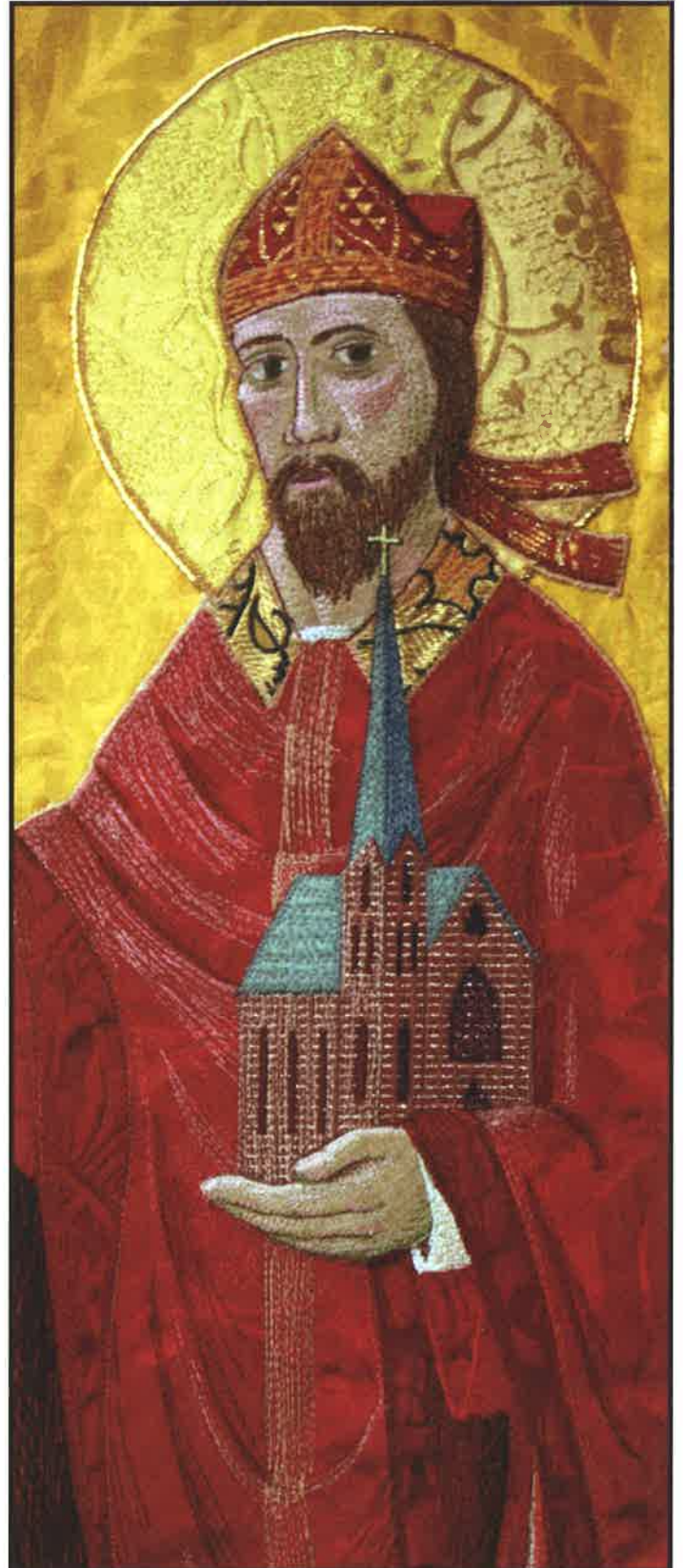

OKTOBERFEST 2018!

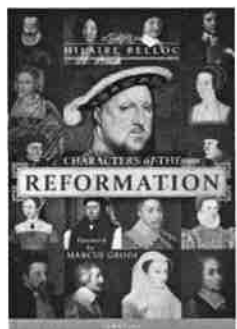
Just like everyone is Irish on St. Patrick's day, everyone is German at Oktoberfest. (Even with Lederhosen, our event chair is less than ¼ German!)

Bi-Monthly Healing Mass on November 20 at Saint Joseph Cathedral

A Mass of Healing and Healing Service will be celebrated on Monday, November 20, 6:30 p.m. at Saint Joseph Cathedral, 212 East Broad Street, Columbus. Following the Mass, a Service of Healing will begin with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, Veneration of relic of the True Cross of Christ, followed by an opportunity for each person to speak individually with a priest and receive prayers of healing for what they seek; the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick will also be available. The Service of Healing will conclude with Benediction. All persons who seek Christ's healing are invited – especially those who suffer with physical illness and infirmities (e.g. cancer and other debilitating diseases and conditions), in addition to those in seek emotional and spiritual healing. All caregivers, family members, and members of the medical community are invited as well. Parking is available at the rear of the Cathedral accessible off East Gay Street; handicap accessible elevator is located in the courtyard (west side of the Cathedral) on East Broad Street. Bi-monthly Healing Masses take place at the Cathedral on the third Monday of the month; this is the last Healing Mass for 2017. During 2018 Healing Masses are scheduled for: January 15, March 19, May 21, July 16, September 17, and November 19. FORMED
THE CATHOLIC FAITH ON DEMAND.

In one of his most fascinating books, Anglo-French writer Hilaire Belloc presents in bold colors the twenty-three principal characters of the Protestant Reformation. He focuses primarily on those figures who changed the course of English history, analyzing their strengths, mistakes, motives and deeds. With brief and vivid chapters, Belloc paints the portraits of Henry VIII, Anne Boleyn, Elizabeth I, Thomas More, Mary Tudor, Thomas Cromwell, Mary Stuart and many others. He illustrates how the motives of Protestant leaders were rarely religious in nature, but usually political or economic. Belloc, who served in Parliament from 1906 to 1910, underscores his study of these powerful personalities with the fact that Christendom was once a single entity under the authority of the Catholic Church. Until the Reformation, he argues, each country viewed itself as a part of the whole. Many European princes, however, resented the power of the Pope. The Reformation, aided by the rise of nationalism, was a means for them to shake off Papal authority and to rule their territories independently. It also gave European monarchs control over the Church and its property in their realms, including the taxes that would normally be sent to Rome. The nobles grew rich by confiscating the wealth of the Church, and resisted reconciliation if that meant returning the wealth to its rightful owner. In subsequent generations, the fear of this possibility gave the noble classes an incentive to remain in the Protestant camp. Belloc warns that this breakup of Christendom may still destroy our Christian civilization. Even those who think they do not like history will be unable to put this book down as it brings history vividly to life. As usual, Belloc's historical perspective offers timeless wisdom and insight rarely seen in modern times.

**MARCH FOR LIFE 2018
PRE-REGISTRATION FORM**

If you are planning / considering attending our March for Life 2018 pilgrimage, please fill out the following information, include a deposit of \$30 and **return to Stephanie Robinson (or the St. Colman office) by November 30, 2017.** (If the deposit is a financial hardship, please let Fr. Hahn, Fr. Hartge or Stephanie Robinson know . . . no one is refused attendance for this reason.) The estimated cost per person this year is \$185 (includes bus, hotel accommodations, a couple of meals, t-shirt, and snacks/water on the bus). We will be asking for sponsorships, so if you know of someone who would like to sponsor a pilgrim please let them know. There will be additional paperwork to fill out prior to leaving for Washington in January. We will have 50 spots available for High School teens, young adults (former Youth Group members in college), Members of St. Colman Knights of Columbus Council, clergy and adult chaperones. They will be on a first come first serve basis, with priority given to actively participating youth group members. Eighth graders are permitted on the pilgrimage as long as they have a parent or designated adult chaperone with them. All adults over 18 and out of High School must be safe environment compliant, meaning have taken the PGC training session and had a BCI fingerprint background check completed.

This is our preliminary itinerary:

Thursday, January 18 – leave St. Peter’s approximately 12:30 a.m. travel to Washington DC. We are leaving early again this year as it worked out well by getting great seats in the main part of the Basilica! If we arrive in DC prior to noon, a side tour may be arranged. We plan to arrive at the Basilica at approximately noon. There will be ample time to tour the Basilica, with those who have not been there being the first to explore. Bring money to take turns eating in the restaurant at the Basilica prior to Mass. We will attend the Vigil Mass for Life at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception at 5:30 p.m., Following Mass, we will check in at our hotel where we plan to have pizza waiting on us for dinner.

Friday, January 19 – We will celebrate Mass and have a continental breakfast at the hotel prior to leaving and traveling in to Washington DC. Tour location still to be determined. We will eat lunch at noon in the Reagan Building food court, where we will have meal vouchers. At approximately 1:00 we will join thousands of others as we March for Life! After the March, we will take a group shot near the Senate Office building. At this time, we will board the bus and leave DC, along the way we will stop for dinner. We will be traveling to Gettysburg, where we will have hotel rooms for Friday night.

Saturday, January 20 – Tour destinations still being determined. Return home.
